

Point in Time count

The US Department of Housing and Urban Development requires an annual census of people experiencing homelessness, in emergency shelter and transitional housing on a specified night. This data gives us a one-day snapshot of homelessness to compare from year to year.

To preserve the safety of clients, volunteers and staff during the federal immigration enforcement surge in January, Hennepin County did not conduct any 2026 unsheltered count activities.

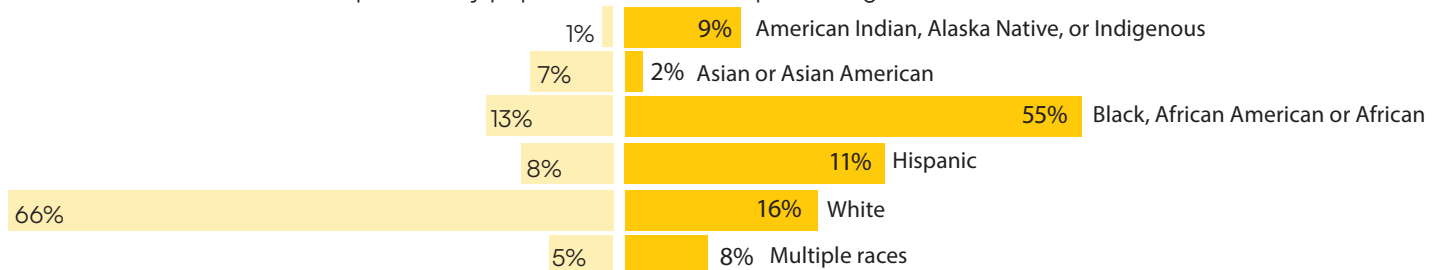
