BEST Car Seat Training

Each foster parent transporting children under the age of 9 must complete the Basic Education for Safe Travel (B.E.S.T). This training includes the online Car Seat Basics followed by the in-person car seat check within 30 days after finishing the Car Seat Basics. The car seat checks are held at the Northwest Family Service Center in Brooklyn Center.

1. Each foster parent in the home must complete the Car Seat Basic online training, separately.
2. Complete the Car Seat Basic online training <https://carseateducation.org/product/car-seat-basics-1>
3. Once you receive your certificate, email fostercare@hennepin.us to register for your Car Seat Check.
4. A vehicle is required for the Car Seat Check. If you are a provider without access to a vehicle, speak with your licensing worker as they will need to register you for the training.
5. If you are unable to attend the upcoming dates you can find a list of BEST approved facilitators here <https://buckleupmn.org/best-locator/>. You will be charged a fee by these B.E.S.T Facilitators.
