What Happens Next

- You finished your Coordinated Entry assessment. Your household will be added to a list with other households that qualify.
- To qualify for these programs, you must be staying in a shelter, living outside, or trying to leave domestic violence when you are referred.

How Housing Is Given Out


- When housing programs have openings, they first help people who have the greatest needs and have been homeless the longest. You will be informed if you are referred to a housing program.
- We cannot promise housing through Coordinated Entry or that it will happen right away. Many people do not get housing because there are more people who need homes than there are homes available. Keep looking for other housing options.

What You Should Do

- Contact your assessor at least every 30 days, or anytime your income, household size, contact information, or living situation changes.
- You can say no to a housing offer. Your name may stay on the list, but we cannot guarantee when you will be chosen again.

Types of housing	Description
Transitional housing	Temporary housing and support services for people experiencing homelessness, to help them transition to permanent housing within 24 months
Rapid Rehousing	Permanent housing for homeless households, with short-term (up to three months) and medium-term (four to 24 months) rental assistance and support services
Permanent supportive housing	Permanent rental assistance or leasing and supportive services to help households experiencing homelessness and a disability to achieve housing stability
